The Opportunity: A tutor who will provide tutoring services to students currently enrolled in Sault College's Social Service Worker – Indigenous Specialization program. The incumbent will assist tutees with comprehension and retention of course related materials related to program curriculum through study groups and one-on-one tutorial sessions via the use of supplemental practice exercises and discussion. The tutor will work with program faculty and/or counsellors on a consultation basis as required to ensure tutorial content is relevant and tutee needs are met. The incumbent will maintain statistics of students served via sign-in sheet and preparing summary reports as required.

What you need to be successful:

- degree in social work and/or a bachelor of education
- excellent knowledge of Indigenous culture, history and worldviews
- previous experience working with Indigenous learners in a secondary or post-secondary environment
- sensitivity to, and understanding of the diverse academic, socioeconomic, and cultural/ethnic backgrounds of the students
- excellent oral and written communication skills
- ability to work in a remote learning environment
- strong commitment to academic excellence and student success
- must possess strong interpersonal skills to work effectively within a collaborative team environment
