**PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:**

Provides students with the skills and knowledge to work with children, youth and their families in a wide range of settings and engage in prevention, intervention and treatment activities of various kinds. Students receive training in field areas of counselling, group dynamics, recreation, psychology and social issues, with emphasis on activity-based learning including practice and application.

**ENTRANCE REQUIREMENT:**

Ontario Secondary School diploma with Grade 12 English (ENG4C) OR Mature Student Status (an applicant lacking the formal minimum admission requirements may be admitted through the mature student application process. Mature student applicants may be referred to College Counselling for academic testing and a recommendation from the Counsellor to the Registrar for consideration in their admission. Mature applicants must still submit their high school transcripts and may also be asked for a resume).
