Library Space

Due to Covid 19 restrictions, the Library Space is currently unavailable to students and staff.

Layout

The Library consists of three floors, all with spaces geared towards student success.

- Floor 1: Reading Room, Front Desk, and Display Under the Stairs
- Floor 2: Computer Lab, Peer Tutoring Room, DVD Collection, Reference Collection, and New Books
- Floor 3: Study Rooms, Lounge, Open Work Space/Balcony, Stacks (main book collection of 24000+ academic titles), Silent Computer Lab, and Individual Study Carrels

Study Rooms

 - 1-3 also contain webcams
- Study Room 5: In hallway between Lounge and Stacks
 - Contains: table, chairs, computer, whiteboard, and flat-screen monitor to be used as a digital whiteboard with up to 4 displays
- Study Rooms 6-7: In hallway between Lounge and Emergency Exit
 - o Contains: table, chairs, computer, whiteboard
